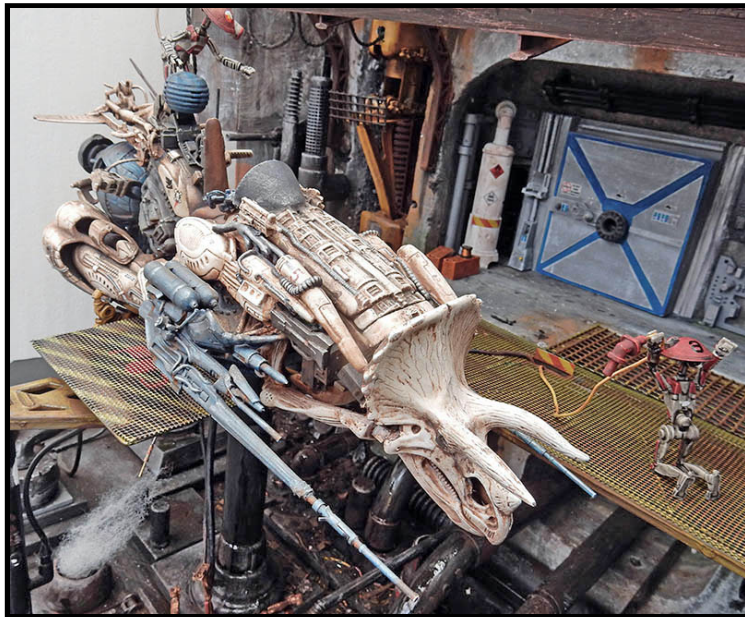

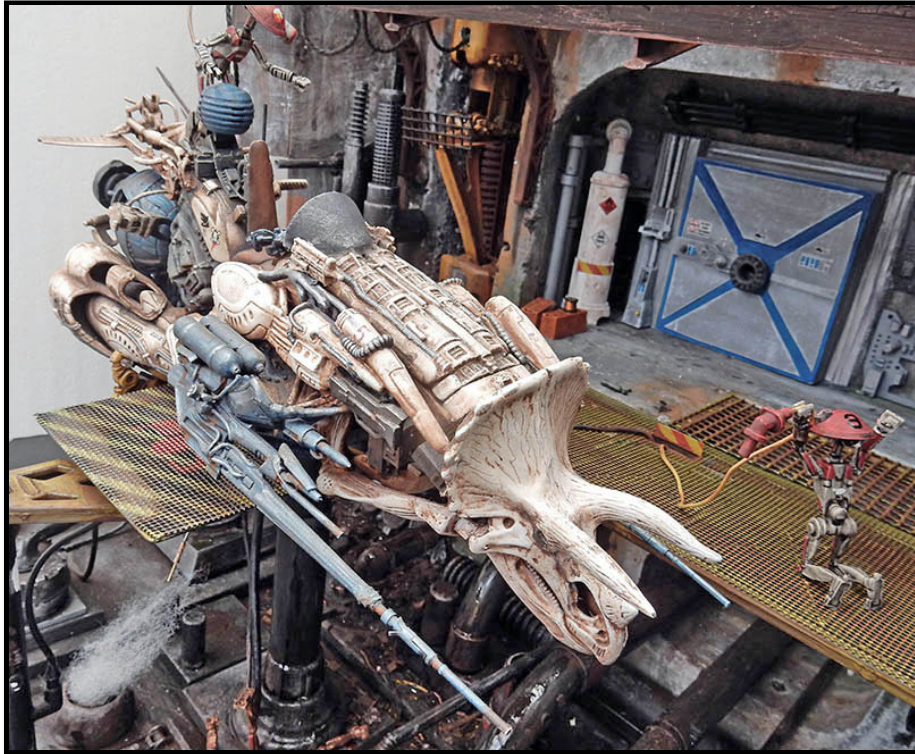

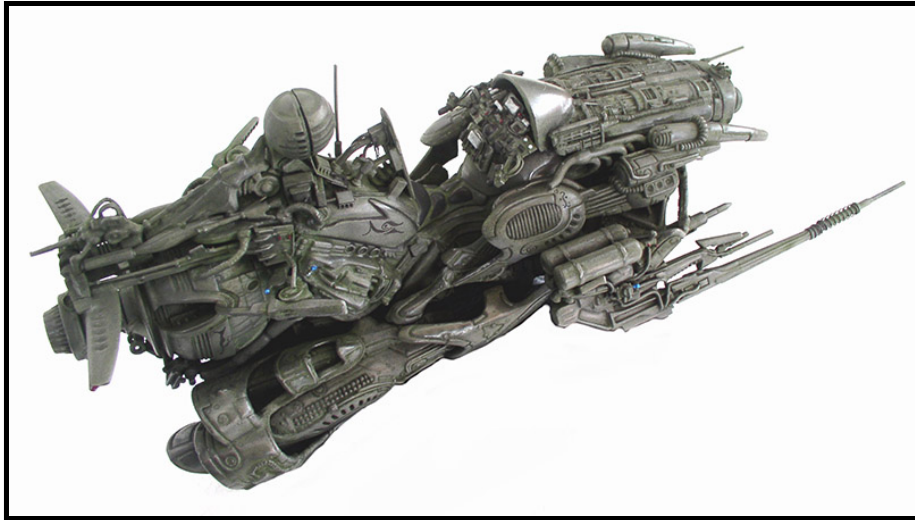


A unique diorama made mostly from recycled materials...

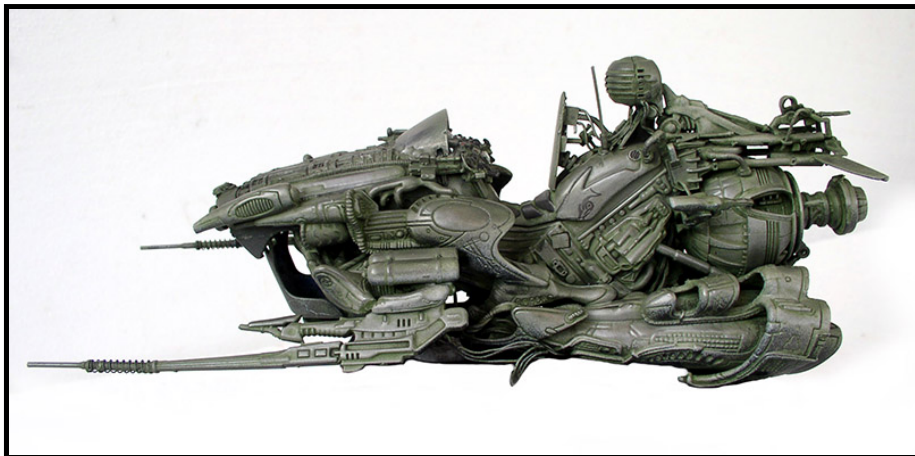


The motorcycle is part of a series of five models sold as collectible toys by McFarlane...

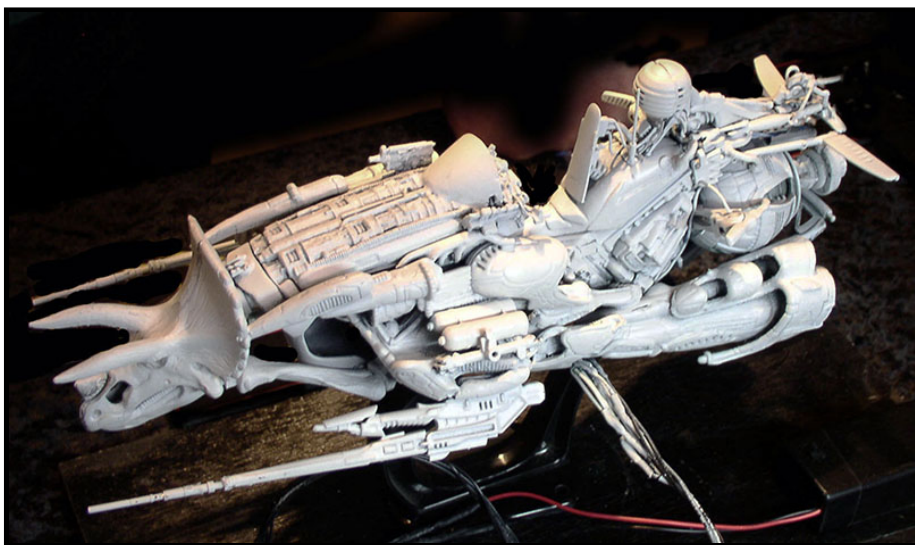
The wheels are removed, details are added, and then a coat of white primer is applied...



It's painted Humbrol gray-green...



It is then weathered using the standard method already described in numerous tutorials...



Then, finally, a figurehead is added—a toy dinosaur head—along with colored LED lighting...

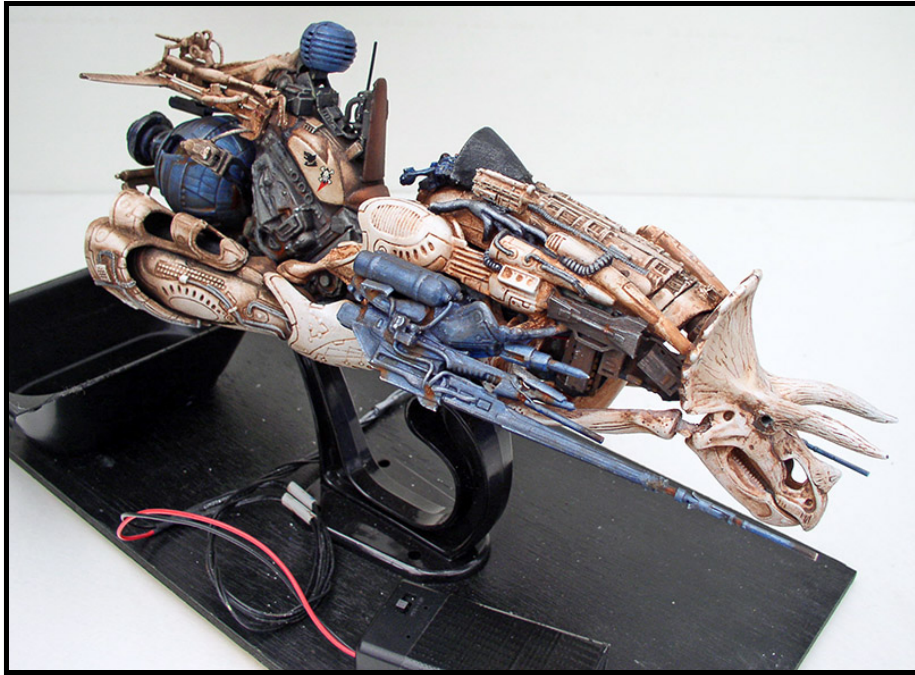


It just goes to show that even after years of practice, you can still question everything along the way: the paint is removed, a new coat

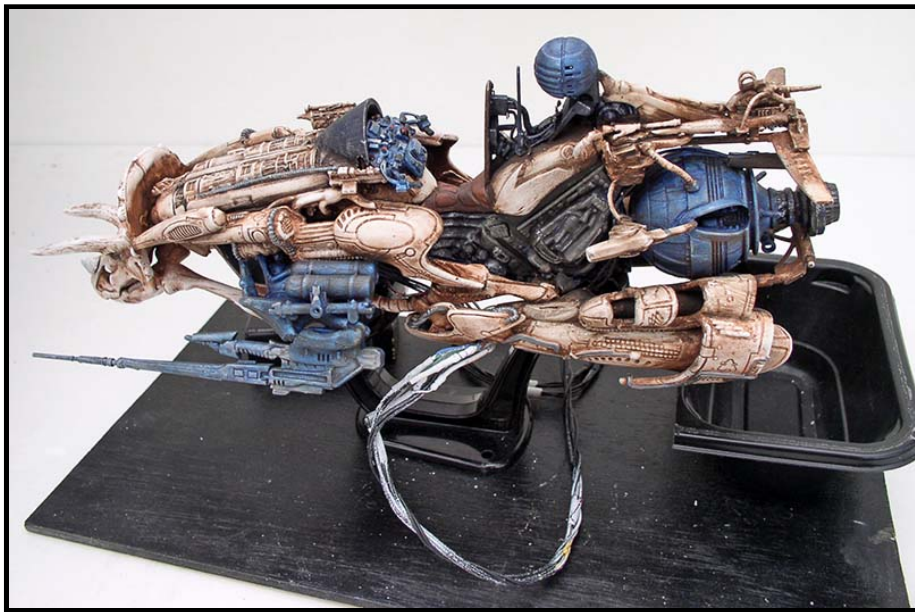
A coat of primer is applied. You can see a blue LED on the back...



The new painting is made from turpentine-based varnish and powdered pigments for oil painting—blue, sienna, and ochre...

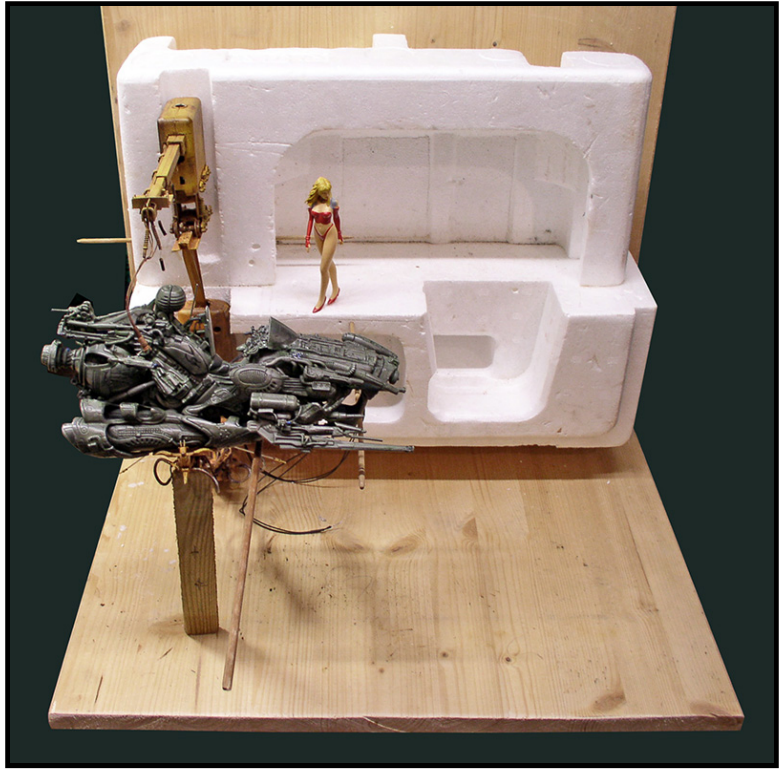


Another view... Finishing patina using graphite powder on the barrel and metal parts...

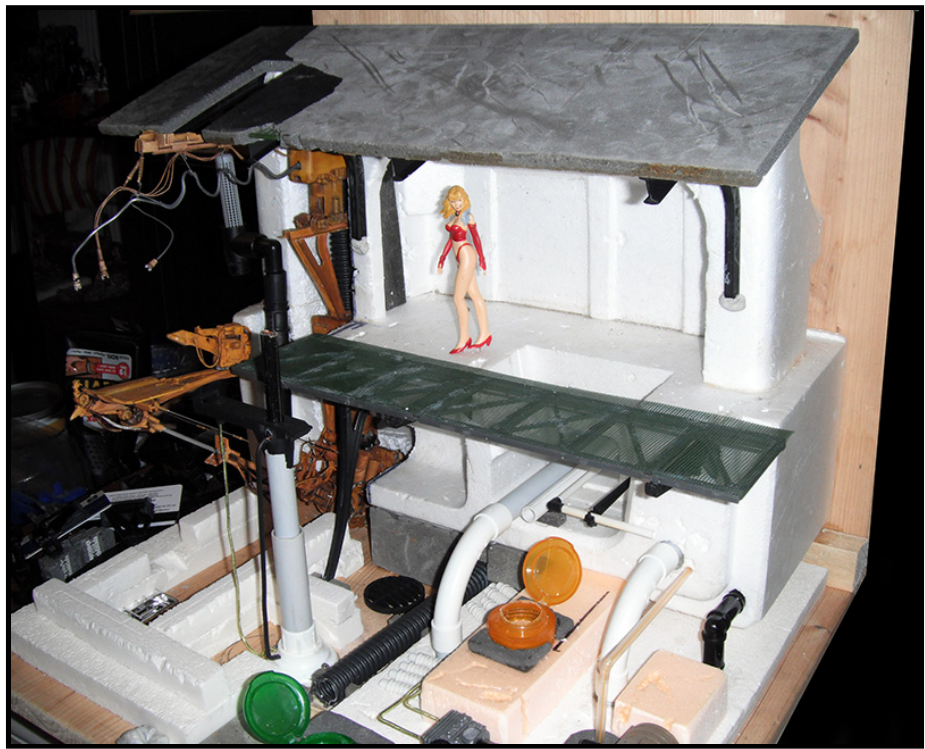


You can see the lighting cables that will be incorporated into the set...

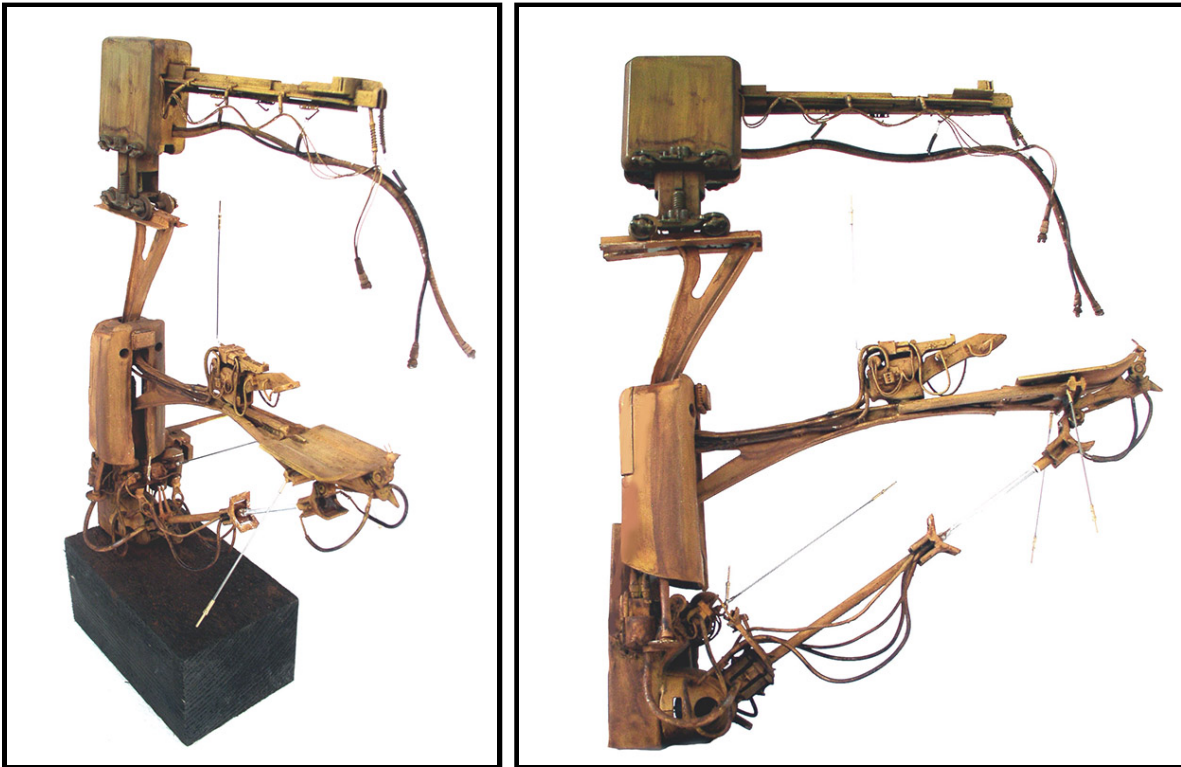


Wood base + packaging polystyrene...

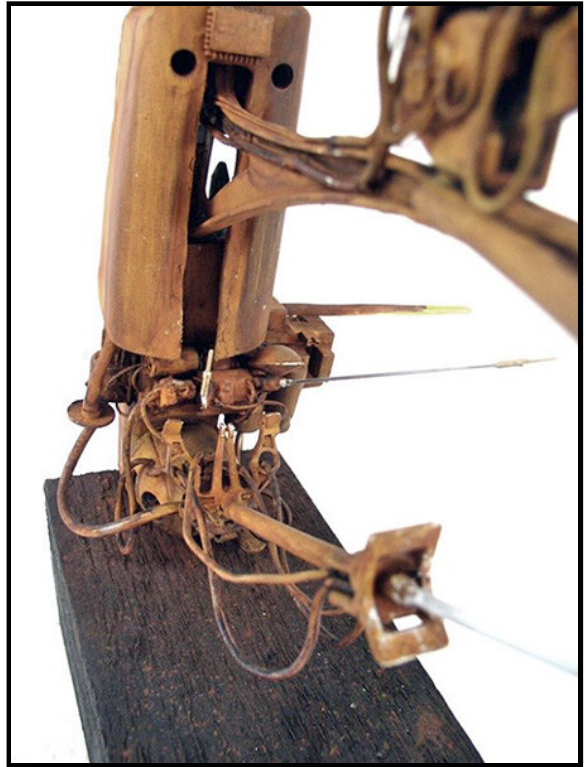
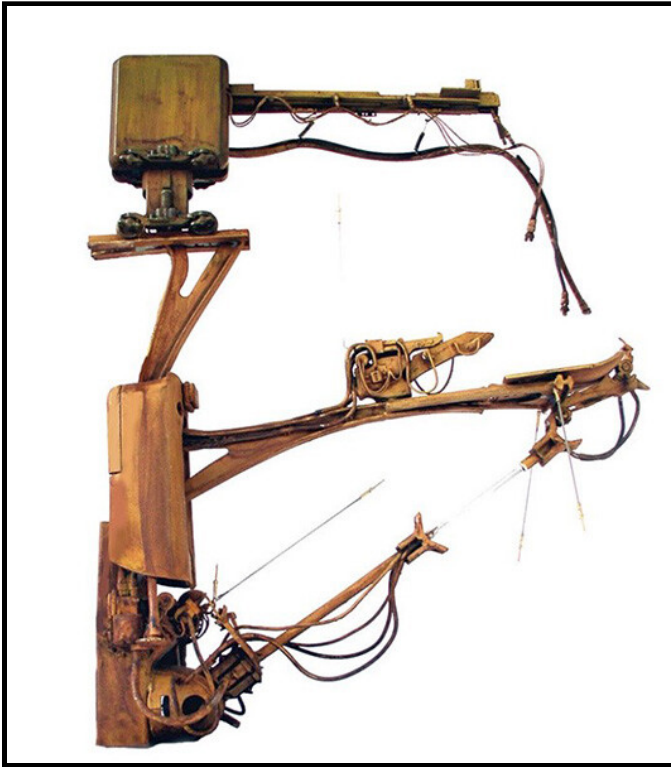


Addition of various plastic parts, including construction materials, HO-scale train parts, foam board, straw, food packaging caps, etc.

THE MOTORCYCLE PORCH



It's made from pieces of plastic coat hangers, parts from cell phone hands-free kits, and parts from the surplus bin...



Paint: glossy yellow spray paint and decorative earth pigment for a weathered look...

After a few modifications, it was painted gray and given a weathered look. In the foreground, you can see the paints that were used...

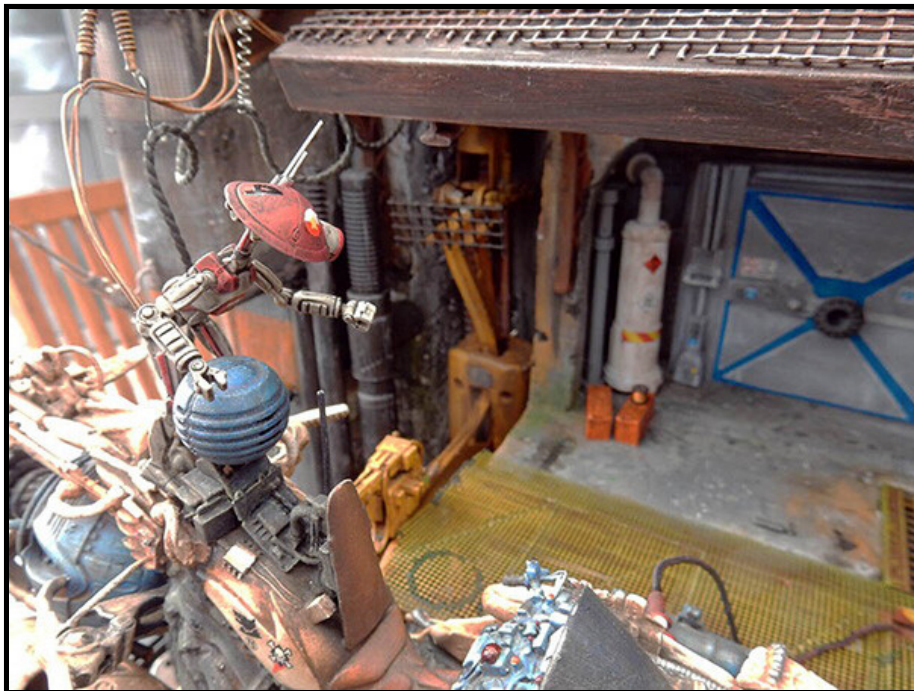


View from the portico...
