This diorama depicting the German retreat from the Eastern Front will feature three tanks and a substantial number of figures—78 in all...

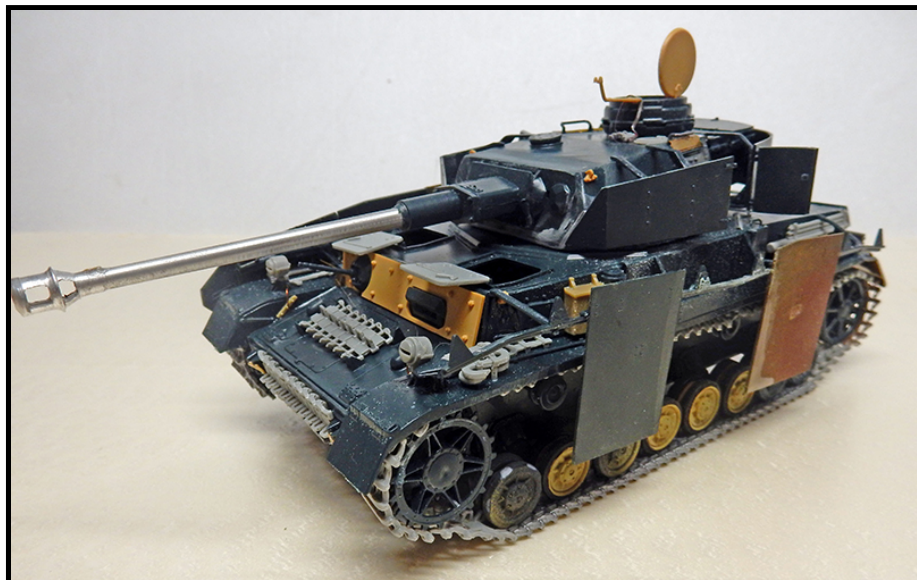
The first tank is a Panzer IV Ausf. G modified into a Panzer IV Ausf. H, with, among other things, the addition of schürzen (armor plates)...



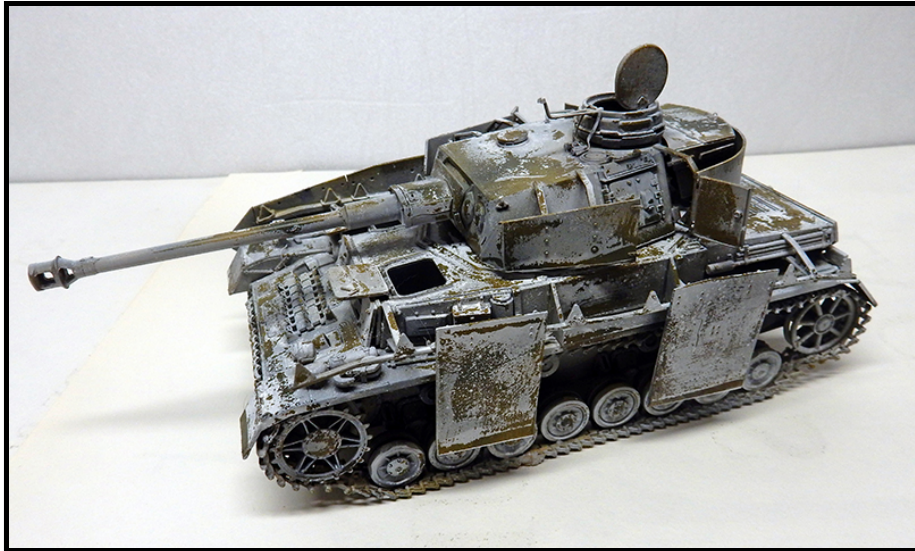
A photo of the vehicle, which was repainted and treated with hairspray to achieve the white finish...



The second tank is the old Italeri kit...



...It has been significantly improved with a metal barrel, track pads, photo-etched parts, and new separate armor plates...



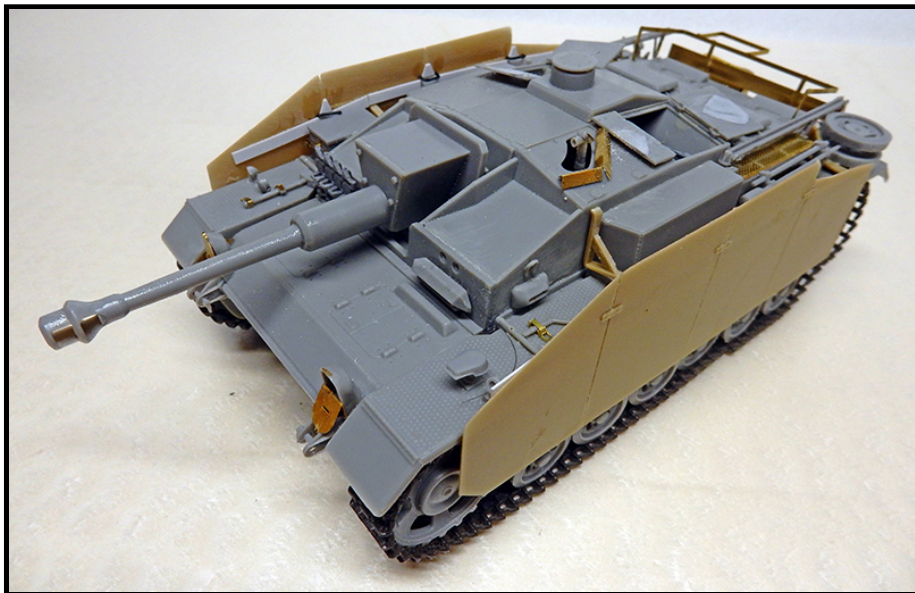
It was painted in a sand-yellow and green camouflage pattern and then treated with hairspray to achieve the white color...



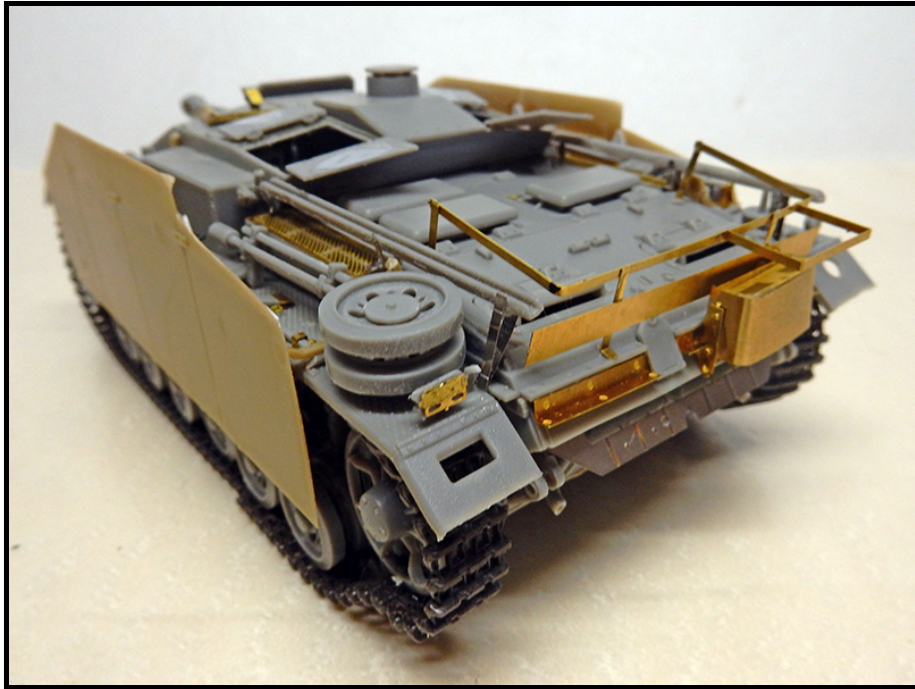
A view of the scenery...



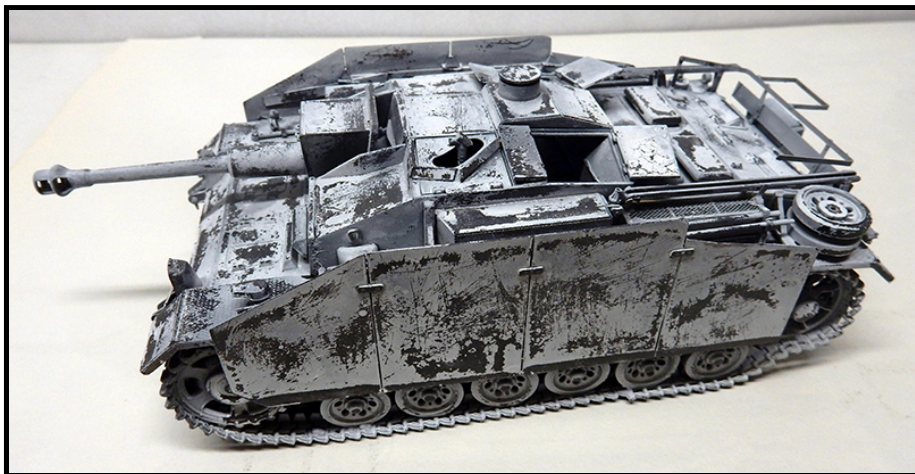
The third model is an assault gun—a Stug III Ausf. F...



This one will also be equipped with schürzen, although generally speaking, most Stug III ausfGs were equipped with them...



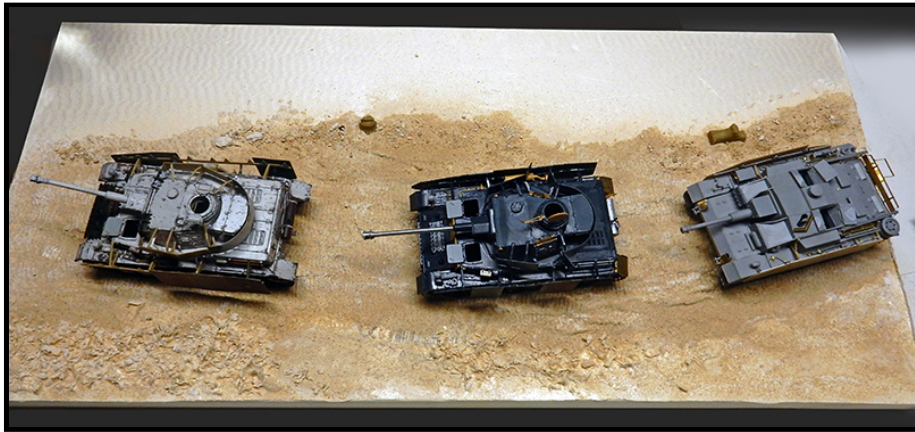
Rear view - It comes with a nearly complete photo-etched kit...

The figurines





Infantry troops. They're made from resin miniatures and boxed plastic kits; some have been modified. The weapons on the resin versions have almost all been replaced because the resin warps the small parts, rendering them unusable. All the straps are added using thin sheets of lead...



The soldiers' positions on the tank are based on a real vintage photograph...

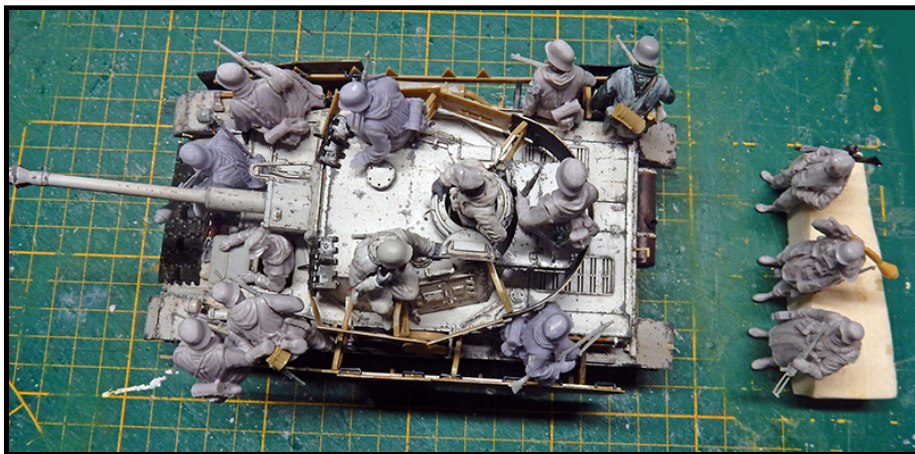


After painting... The miniatures are painted using Humbrol oil-based paints and Winsor & Newton artist paints...

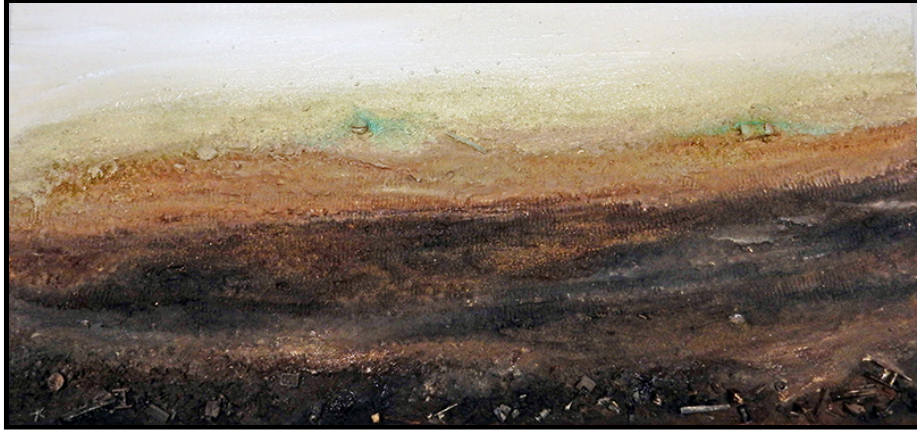

The Setting



It consists of an extruded polystyrene panel glued to a 41 cm x 78 cm MDF board...

Various objects and debris are scattered in the foreground. The whole scene is sprinkled with fine sand...



Then I painted the background with acrylic paint—from large tubes meant for artists—using winter mud as my inspiration...



White powder is added to simulate snow. The final shot will depict a snow-covered field. We also apply thick, glossy, clear acrylic gel to the water holes and track marks...

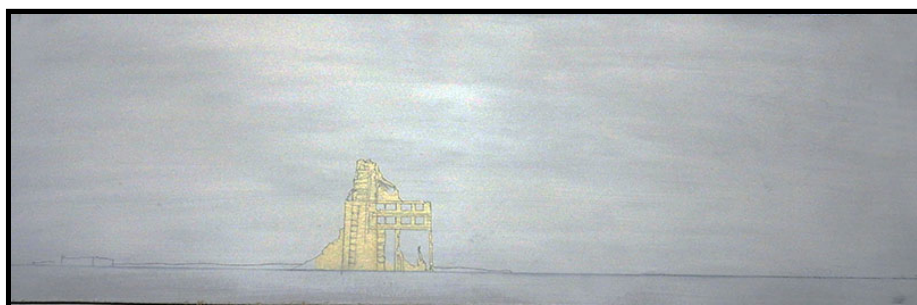


The tanks are glued to the diorama in their final positions using fast-setting wood glue...
