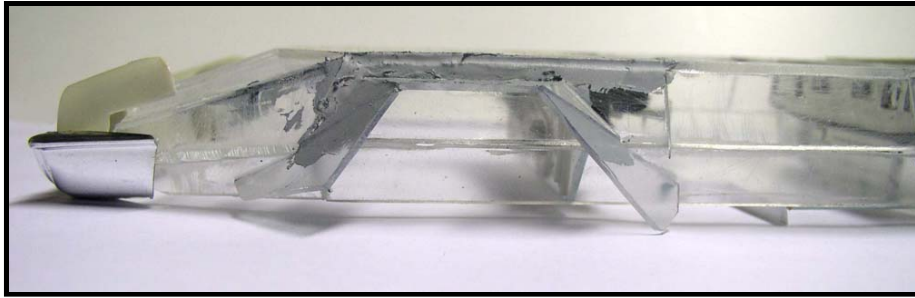




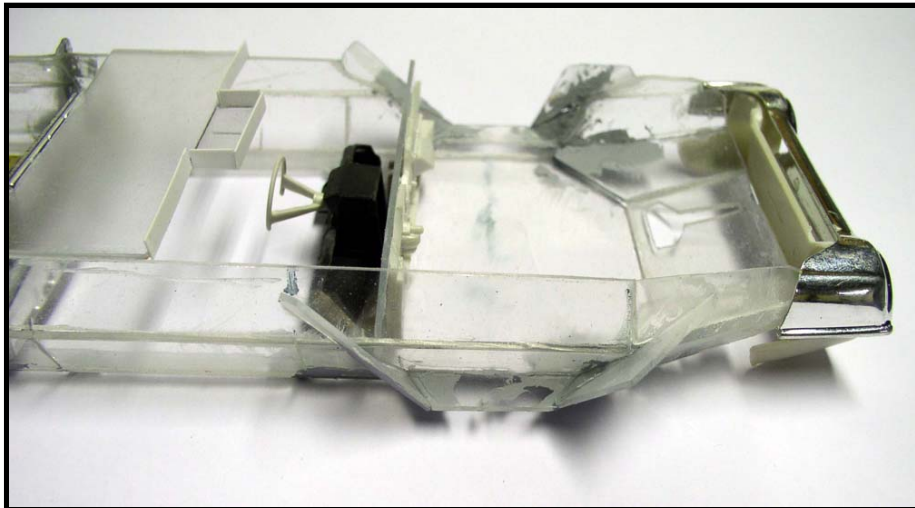
This model is based on a 1/48-scale kit. Photocopies of parts enlarged to 1/24 scale will serve as blueprints for the future model...



The 1/48-scale model, with, next to it, the start of the "scratch-built" assembly using plastic card cut according to the plans obtained...



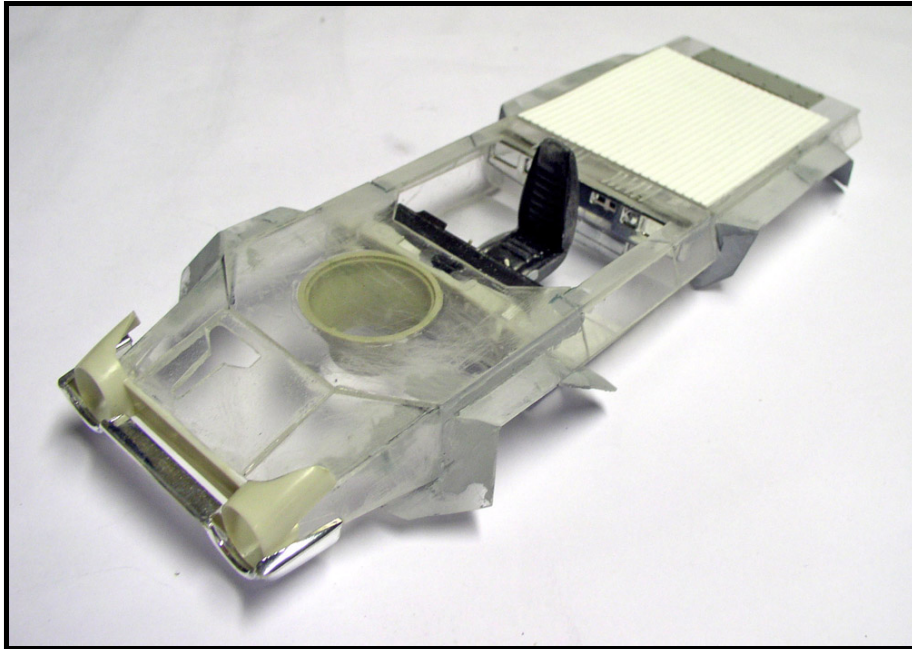

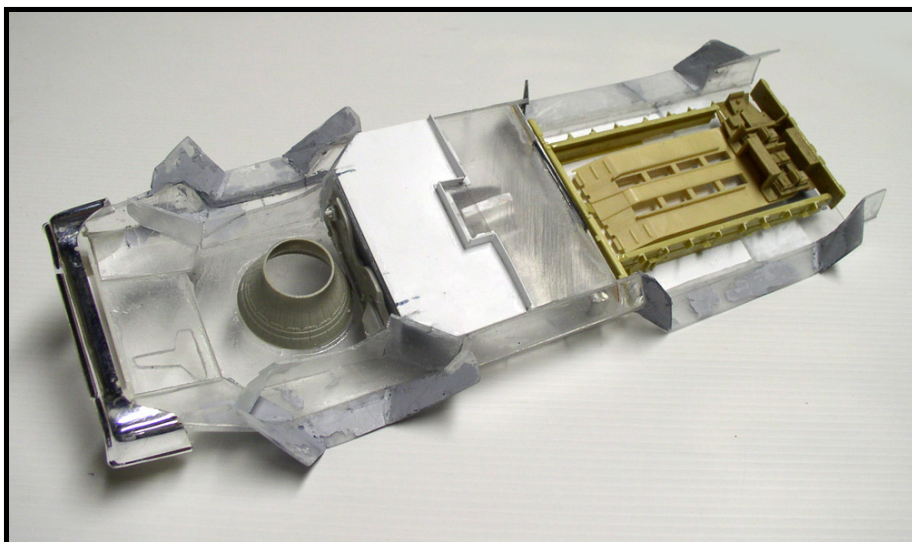

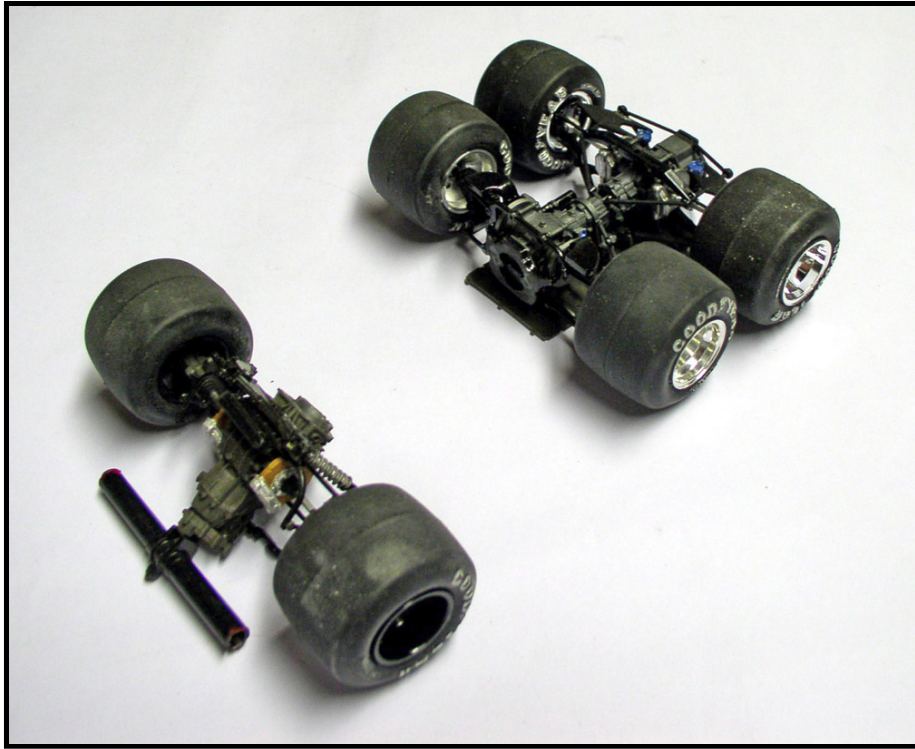

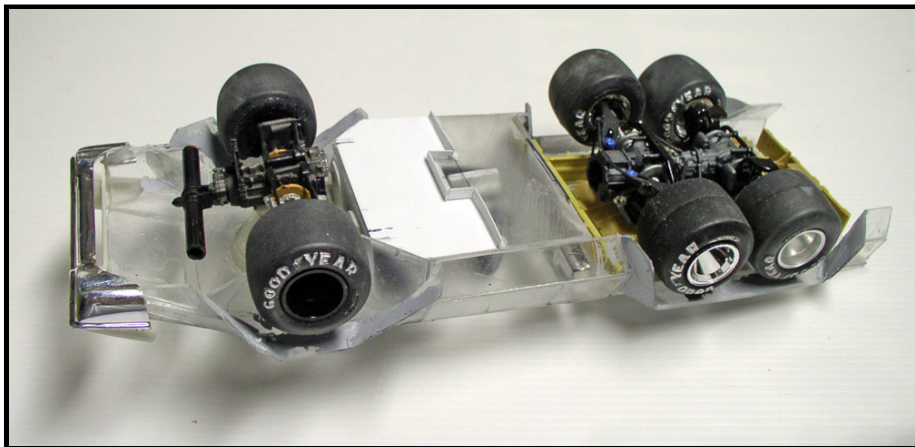
An overview of the wings in place... And here, I strayed from the original design when it came to the details, ultimately following my inspiration...



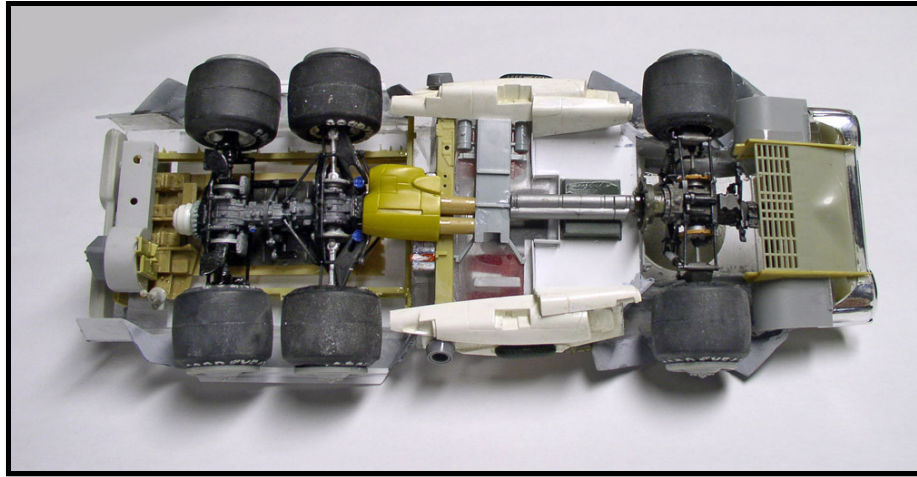
View from below: after adding a front bumper—a round part that will serve as the engine and secure the front axle—while at the rear, other parts will complete the assembly...



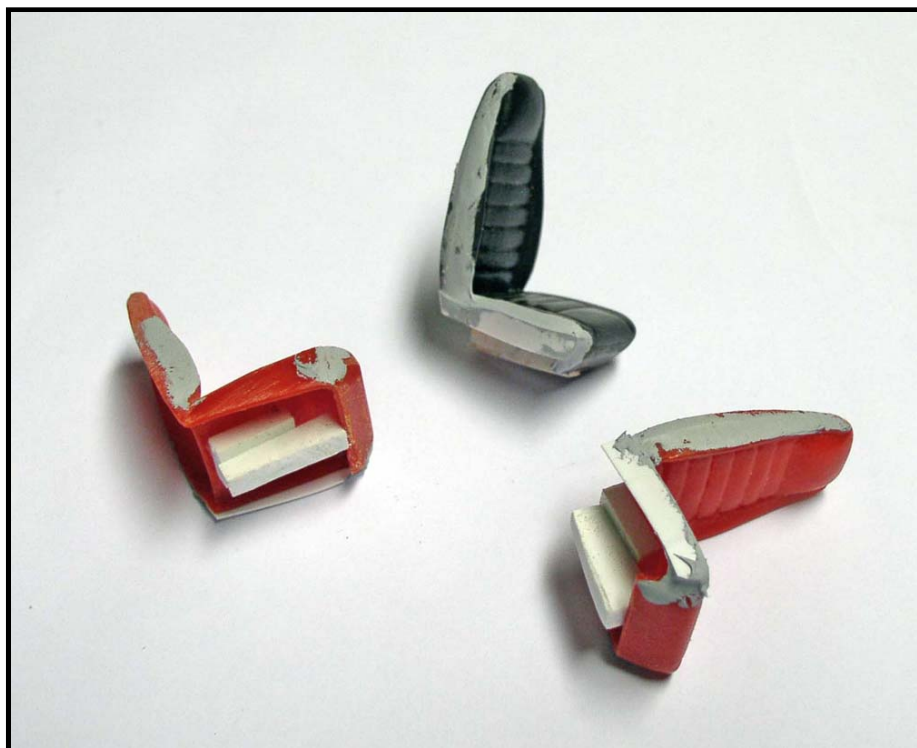
The wheels: On a 1/20 scale, these wheel assemblies—equipped with gearboxes—will be attached to the chassis. These flexible Formula 1 vinyl tires will be perfect for driving on Martian sand...



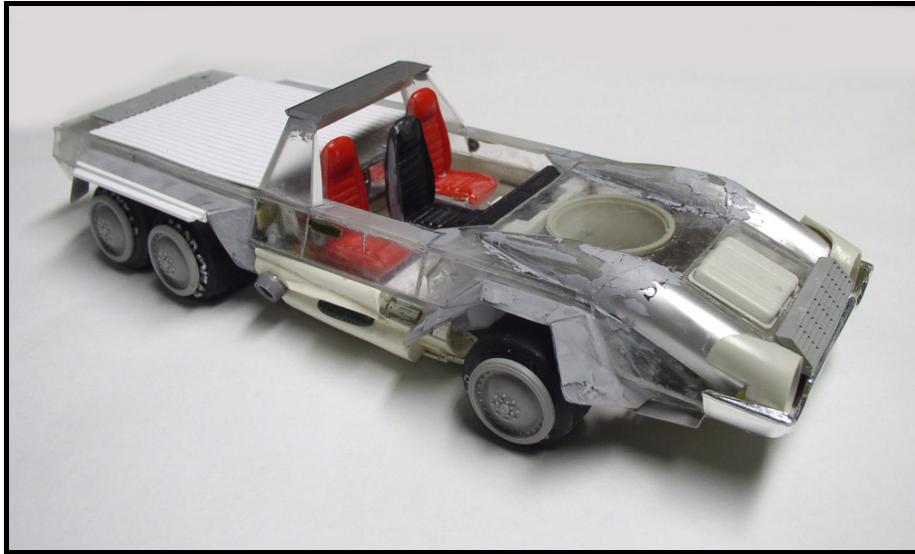
The axles secured in place...

The 1/48 scale kit includes three seats, including the driver's forward-mounted center seat. I kept the same layout for the cockpit... Car seats were slightly modified to fit the space...



The seats in place for the simulation... The bodywork. The bumper and the new headlights called for a curved fender effect to achieve a more cohesive look... Half of an airplane fuel tank and some aluminum sheets will be perfect for achieving a consistent alignment...



The floor of the aft deck, where the cannon will be installed, is finished with an Evergreen plastic sheet...



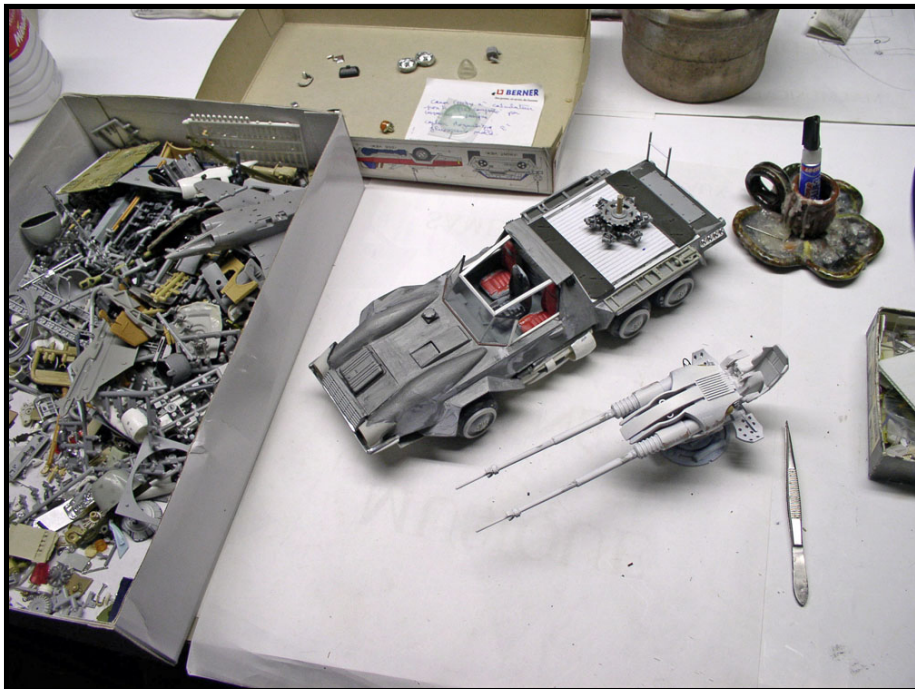
Another view of the body. A lot of sanding and filling will be required to remove the seams on the fenders and the curved sections...

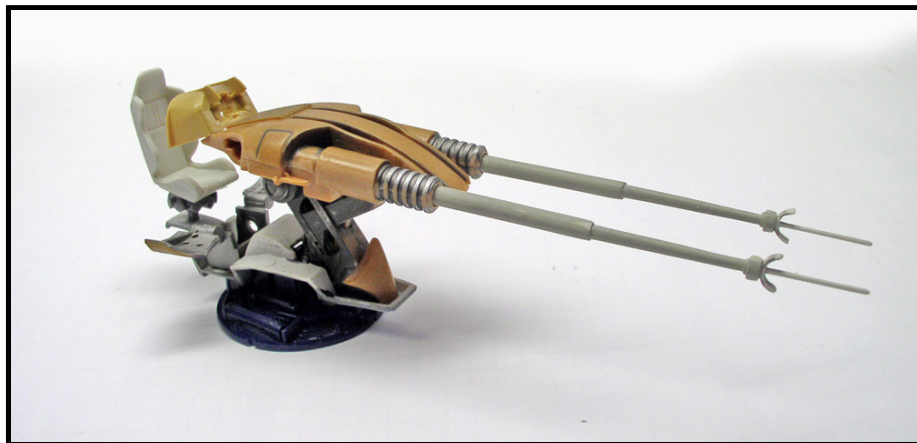

The cannon, first assembly. Star Wars fans will surely recognize some of the parts...

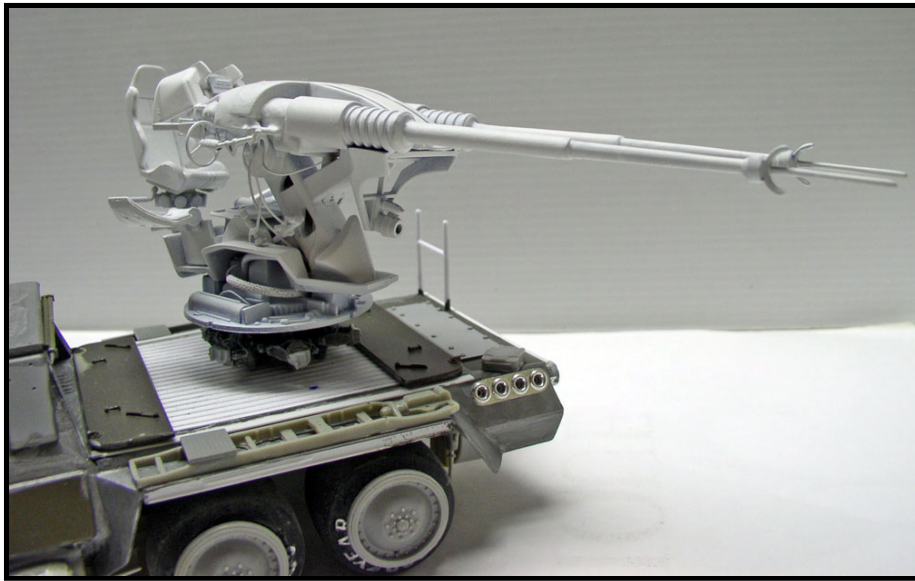
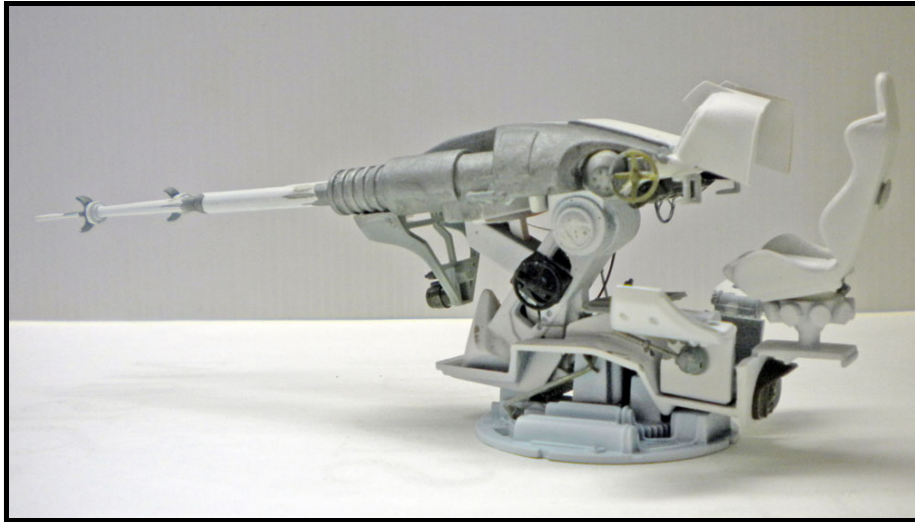

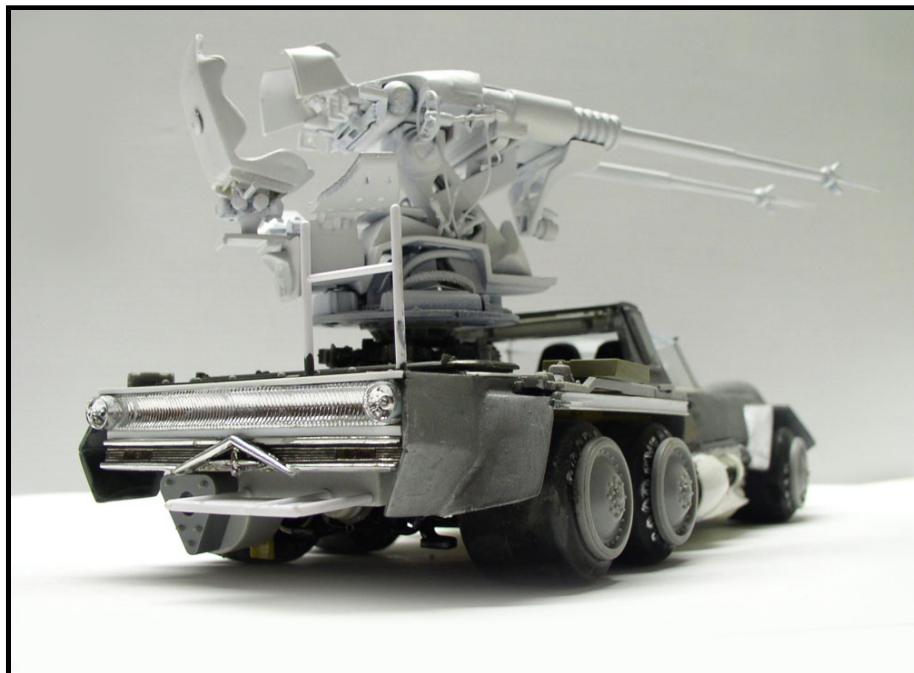


The finished barrel is given a coat of white primer...

The figures are painted with Winsor & Newton oil paints for the faces and Humbrol for the rest of the equipment...

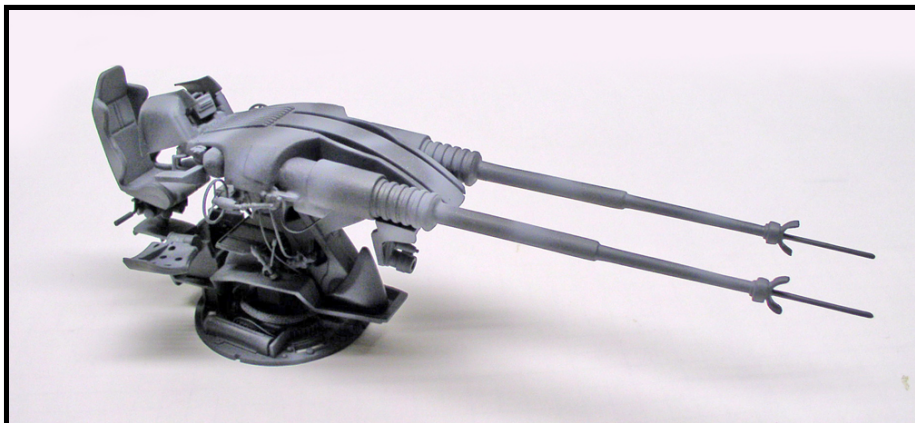

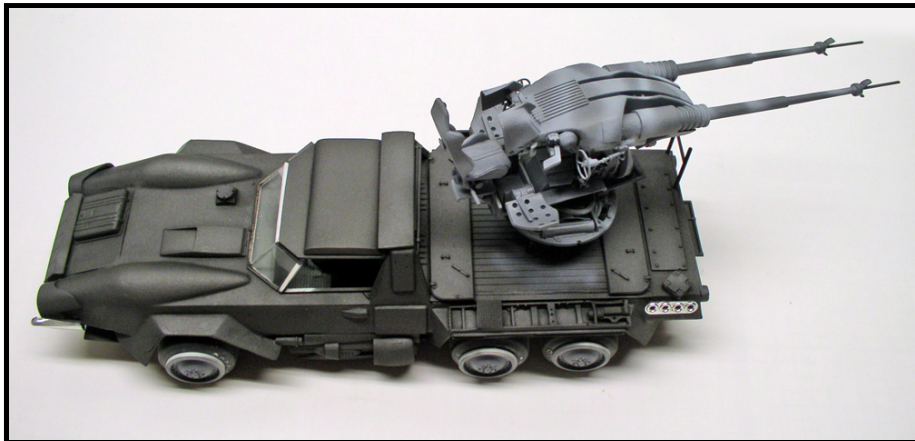
Base coat applied with an airbrush using Humbrol Black 33. Then a "light coat" of Model Master Chrom Trim Black...

The model needs to dry for several days before the paint is finished...



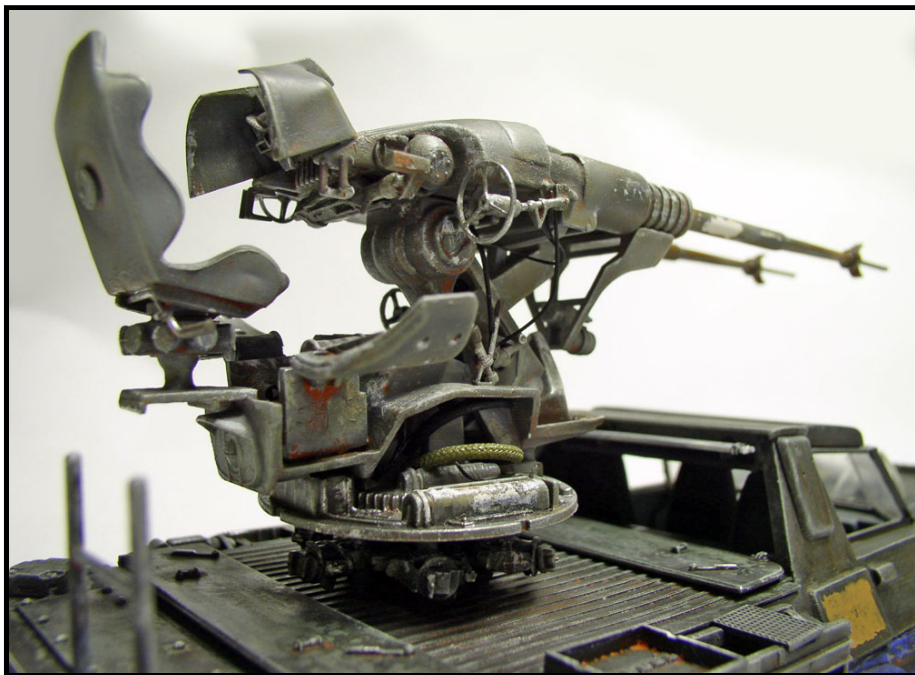
Several colors will be used for the paint chipping, the plates, and the vents: Humbrol 31, 87, 183, BLUE 14...

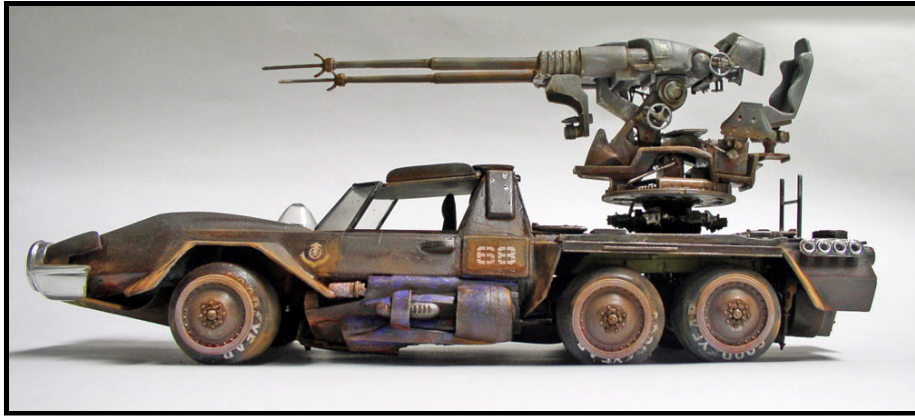

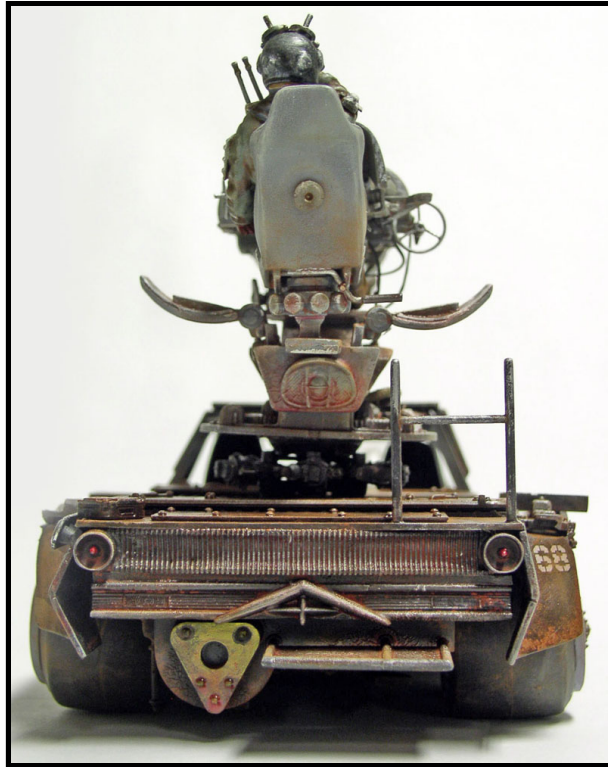
Some rust-colored pastel powder will provide the finishing touch and help it blend into the surroundings...

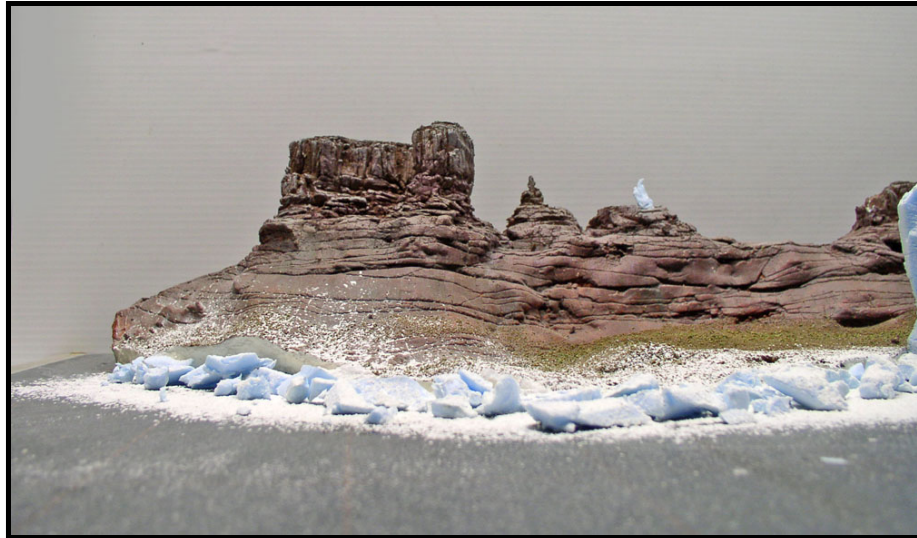




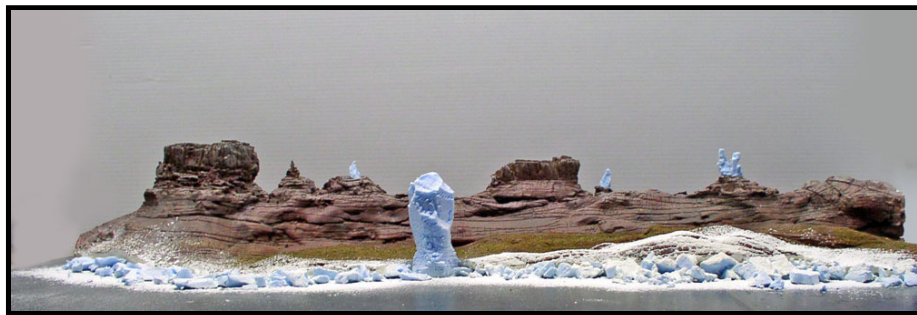
The Setting



A wooden panel measuring 0.74 m x 0.42 m will serve as the base. A piece of Monument Valley scenery salvaged from an old diorama will serve as the backdrop for the horizon...



The extruded polystyrene scenery has been improved. Rocks will serve as a link between the mountains and the ground...



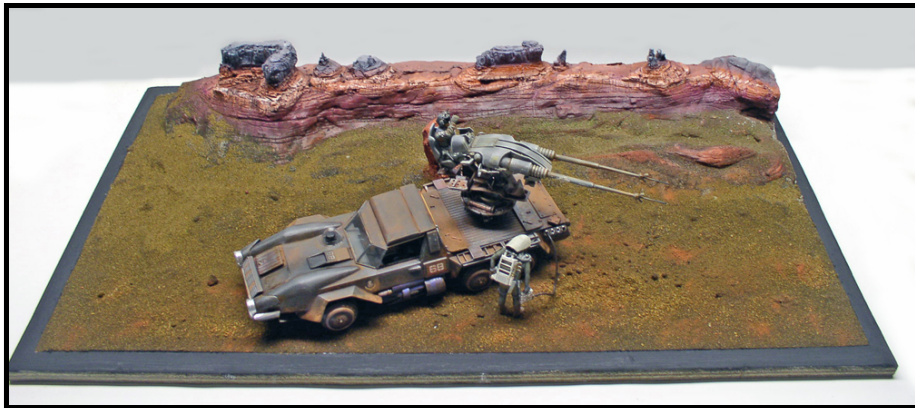
A view of the entire set...
